STUDENT EXCHANGE APPLICATION for YR 11

APPLICATION PACK, for 2017

St Andrew's has exchanges with schools in several different regions of the world. You are invited to apply for an exchange in one of those regions.

The exchanges are for 8 – 10 weeks and take place either in terms one or two. Hosting can be in terms one, two or three. For 2017, the exchange destinations are:

Year 11:

Stanford Lake College – South Africa (1 boy and 1 girl; go end of term one)

Bridge House School – South Africa (1 boy and 1 girl, go end of term one)

Gordonstoun College, Scotland (1 boy and 1 girl; go January-February)

To find out information on the schools, pick up an application pack from Mr. Tauti office in the library or find on Moodle (Co-Curricular/Student Exchanges) You can talk to students who have already been there, read their reports in the Collegian, or see the exchange leaders (Molly Dore and George Flavill) or Mr Tauti. Think about which country and which school would suit you.

If you wish to apply, complete an application form, and return to the Mr. Tauti office. You will need to also have two references, one from your tutor and one from another staff member. Give the appropriate sheets to these people for them to fill in confidentially. The sheets are returned to Mr. Tauti separately.

A shortlist of applicants will be drawn up, and candidates interviewed.

Timeline:

Applications announced, Week 5

Applications due, Wednesday 15 June (WK 7)


Shortlist announced, Week 8

Interviews, week 8 with Mr. Tauti, Mr Anderson, Mrs Radcliffe and an Exchange Leader.

You need to think this over carefully, and talk with your parents.

- Consider how you would cope out of your comfort zone.
- Discuss how comfortable you would be with hosting an exchange student in return.
- **Your costs** will include airfares, 500 in the currency of the country (eg £500) for school expenses (not all of this may be spent and the remainder will be reimbursed when you leave), and spending money. Will you need to save, fund raise, work, to be able to raise this amount?
- Weigh up the advantages of an exchange against the work to catch up with NCEA when you return. Remember, you will be away for a whole term.
- Think about how well you can represent St Andrew's College.
